History of The Otago Golf Club

Establishment of Golf in NZ



It was in 1871, and in Dunedin, that the first semblance of order came to the game of golf in New Zealand.

From humble beginnings on nine holes in a pasture, only "*half an hour's stroll from the Central Post Office*", the game has spread throughout the country. Earliest reference to the game in New Zealand came in September, 1863 when the Otago Witness carried an advertisement seeking "*gentlemen desirous of forming a golf club*".

While there was no shortage of gentlemen in Dunedin at that time, there was obviously a lack of interest in the game. For it wasn't until 1869 that the first balls were struck.

The man behind the move has become a legend. He was Charles Ritchie Howden, the father of New Zealand Golf. Howden was the sort of Scot on whom the early prosperity of Dunedin was based. By the time 1871 came along he was financially secure, as well as young and enthusiastic enough to be a solid driving force behind the development of the game.

It was only to be expected that when a dozen players gathered to form a club in September, 1871, that it should be Charles Ritchie

Howden who became the first Club Captain. The same meeting set the annual subscription at a guinea and gave the Committee the task of securing equipment for members. No clubs or balls were available and members had to send to England for what they required.

The twenty eight members of the new organisation decided that its name should be the Dunedin Golf Club.

The first few games were played at Caversham but early in 1872, the City Council gave permission for the establishment of a golf course at Mornington. The nine-holer was laid out by Howden and a Committee member. The first tee just happened to be very handy to Fogarty's Hotel which soon provided a locker room, Clubhouse and the first 'nineteenth' in New Zealand.

Fairly regular competitions proceeded for a couple of years but the very nature of the Course assured it of a short life.

The final blow came in 1876 when the 'nineteenth' changed hands. The new landlord soon found himself in bankruptcy and the ensuing sale saw a member of the public secure a complete parcel of all the members' golf clubs for two pounds. When the clubs were tracked down a year later, they were useless. Without a playable course and without equipment, players found the whole business impossible.

It was nearly twenty years before golf once again took organised shape, but in those early years four historic trophies had been established: The Bruntsfield Medal, The St Andrew's Cross, The 1871 Cup and The Telfer Medal.

Course Availability

Tee bookings are essential for all players prior to 5pm on any day.

On some days there are permanent Course reservations.

Examples are:

- Women's Golf Section. Course reserved Tuesday mornings - 8.45am to 12.30pm.
- Midweek Businessmen. Starting tee reserved Wednesdays - 11.00am to 1.15pm.
- Otago Golf Club Veteran Men. Course reserved Thursday mornings – 10.15am to 11.30am.
- Full Playing members. Course reserved Saturdays - all day to 5pm.

Unfinancial Members

Members who have unpaid subscriptions after the designated final payment date (*as per the invoice*) will lose rights to all club facilities either as a member or introduced visitor until all fees are paid in full. The fees will continue to be payable following the loss of rights. It is the responsibility of the member to inform the Club of discontinuance of membership or change of address etc.

Dress Code

To avoid any embarrassment, we ask that you note the Club's Dress Code:

- Players are asked to be neatly attired when playing the Course and when in the Clubhouse.
- Examples of dress considered inappropriate are: beachwear, football wear, sign-written tee shirts, and jandals.
- The Pro Shop, General Manager or Club Captains, have the right to refuse players who do not meet an acceptable dress standard.
- Please note that we are a soft spike course.

Course Usage and Practice

Practice on the Course

In casual play a player may only hit a maximum of two balls on the Course provided that they are not interfering with other players' rounds. Under no circumstances are players to use the Course as a practice area. The Crossways hole is available for putting, short chips and bunker play only.

Practice Facilities

Available to members subject to any restrictions imposed by the General Manager.

Course Etiquette

- Give way to Greens staff at all times.
- Bunkers are to be raked, divots replaced on all areas of the Course and pitch-marks on all the greens to be repaired.
- Maximum of four players per group or four balls in play if a team's event.
- Play is to commence from No.1 tee unless otherwise authorized by the Professional.

Local Rules

To be read in conjunction with the Rules of Golf and any temporary Rules on the noticeboard.

Out of Bounds is defined by

- The kerb line and white posts outlining the carpark, gardens, roadways, tennis courts, Clubhouse area and on or beyond any road that divides the Course.
- Boundary fences and white pegs.

Dropping the Ball without Penalty

- Immovable stones, drains and manhole covers are regarded as immovable objects and Rule 24-2 applies.
- Trees and shrubs, either staked or under 2 club lengths in height, are immovable objects and Rule 24-2 must apply to ensure protection. In obtaining relief, the ball must be dropped in accordance with the Rule.

Irrigation and Drainage Channels

A ball coming to rest on or incurring interference with stance or swing may be lifted, cleaned and dropped without penalty at the nearest point not nearer the hole.

Ground Under Repair

G.U.R is marked by either blue pegged areas which are roped off or circled areas of white painted lines from which play is not optional. If the player's ball lies in the area, or if it interferes with the player's stance or the area of his intended swing, the player must take relief under Rule 25-1.

G.U.R - Dropping Zones (blue pegs or white circled areas):

- No 14 - Left side at the corner - two dropping zones.

Sanded Areas (not within the confines of a bunker) and Native Grass Plantings:

- These are an integral part of the Course and the ball should be played as it lies.

Use of Distance Measuring Devices

Players may use devices that measure distance only. However if a player uses a distance measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect a player's play, (e.g. wind or gradient) the player is in breach of Rule 14-3, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional functions are actually used.

Stone Bridges

All Stone Bridges are within hazards and are an integral part of the Course.

Sprinklers and Second Holes on Greens

All fixed sprinkler heads and 'Second Holes' on a putting green are immovable obstructions and relief from interference by them may be obtained under Rule 24-2.

Aeration Holes

Through the green, a ball that comes to rest in or on an aeration hole may be lifted without penalty, cleaned and dropped, as near as possible to the spot where it lay but not nearer the hole. The ball when dropped must first strike a part of the Course through the green. On the putting green, a ball that comes to rest in or near an aeration hole may be placed at the nearest spot not nearer the hole that avoids the situation.

Speed of Play

The attention of all players is drawn to Rule 6-7 regarding undue delay. In the interest of fair play the Committee will not hesitate to impose the penalties provided by that Rule. The recommended maximum allotted time for the completion of 9 holes has been determined by the Committee as 2 hours 5 minutes and for 18 holes 4 hours 10 minutes.

Please note that in winter conditions the Match Committee will likely initiate an additional rule relating to placing and an embedded ball.

Tee Booking and Score Card Entry

The computer in the upstairs lounge allows for “Tee Booking” and “Score Card Entry” using the touch screen only.

The main menu on the screen shows a Tee Booking button and a Score Entry button. If the screen is blank on arrival, touching the screen will bring up the menu but may take a few moments.

Saturday Competitions

Eligibility: Saturday play is available to all members with Full Playing Rights who are financial members.

Booking Tee Times: Entry sheets are posted in the Clubhouse three weeks in advance, and are presented in thirty minute groups, for both morning, and afternoon fields. Post-entries are available at the Pro-shop from Tuesday on but the Club will not alter the draw format once any previously available slots are filled.

Draw: Published in the Otago Daily Times on Thursday. Copies of the draw are posted on the office notice board and at the Pro-shop who are responsible for changes and additions.

Results: Published on Monday in the Otago Daily Times.

Entry Fee and Registration: Players participating in the competition must pay an entry fee \$3.00 prior to commencing play. Entry into twos, near pin and net eagle competitions are optional and controlled by the Professional. (\$1.00 each)

Handicap: The handicaps of the day are listed on the board in the office window. Players involved in play-offs in stroke events for trophies will play on the same handicap they were on, on the day they tied. Maximum handicap for trophy events is 24 unless the member has lodged ten cards in which case they may play-off that full handicap.

Punctuality: Members are requested to be available to commence play five minutes before advertised starting times.

Recording Scores: All cards must be completed in compliance with the Rules of Golf. Cards are to be placed in the competition box and not handed to officials. They may not be re-claimed once lodged.

Golf Competitions

These notes are only intended to assist in the general concept of how various competitions are played. They must be read in conjunction with the Rules of Golf and in particular the Committee shall lay down the conditions under which a competition is to be played (Rule 33).

Ambrose Competition and Pairs Ambrose

Team stroke event; usually played by a group of four, but can be any number. Each player plays a tee shot at each hole. The captain then selects the best drive which is then played by its owner. The other members retrieve their balls and in turn drop within one club length of the selected position and play their second shots. This procedure of selecting the best position continues until a ball is holed. When on the green, balls are placed on the selected spot.

This event can be played as a gross event, with each group having a spread of handicaps, or as a handicap event where a fraction of the aggregate handicaps is used. For groups of four, one-eighth is popular as the team handicap. For pairs events, half handicap is recommended.

American Foursomes

Both players play tee shots at each hole, and then play a second stroke with their partner's ball. One ball is then selected and play proceeds as in foursomes with the owner of the ball selected, playing the third stroke. Handicap allowance is half of aggregate stroke handicap for stroke competitions. This event is sometimes called "Pinehurst Foursomes".

Canadian Foursomes

Played as above, except that both players play tee shots at every hole, then continue with whichever ball they nominate.

Club Championships

The qualifying for club champs is over two rounds and to be played off the blue tees. The senior , intermediate and junior A divisions are to be played over two rounds while the junior B division is to be played over one round, also off the blue tees.

All players who play the two rounds are eligible for the Bruntsfield Medal which is the best gross score over the two rounds.

For Match Play seniors to use black tees, Intermediate and Junior A to use blue tees, Junior B to use white tees.

The handicap ranges for the divisions are

Senior: up to 6.3 (7)

Intermediate: 6.4 (8) - 10.7 (12)

Junior A: 10.8 (13) – 14.1 (16)

Junior B: 14.2 (17) plus

The top 16 from each division will qualify and a flight competition will be determined according to numbers in each division.

For prizes, the Saturday competition and twos competition will be in three divisions being handicaps of 0-12, 13-18 and 19 plus.

The Match Committee reserves the right to change/alter the playing programme at its discretion.

Eclectic

Competitors play two or more rounds and the eclectic score is the lowest score obtained at each hole on the rounds.

Sometimes the competitions extend over the whole season and the total score for the holes is subject to deduction of half the player's handicap held on the last day of competition.

Four Ball Best Ball Stableford (4BBB)

Two players play as partners, the score on a hole being the better of the two scores. Players must enter both names and both handicaps. The score of each player should also be recorded for each hole.

Foursomes

Two players play as partners and use one ball. The partners strike off alternately from the tee and thereafter strike the ball alternately during the play at each hole. Scoring is done as for a stroke round and the total is subject to a deduction of half the partners' aggregate handicaps.

Note: If either player incurs a penalty stroke it does not alter the rotation of play. In a foursome stroke play competition which consists of more than one stipulated round, the order of play may be changed between rounds unless the Committee had laid down as a condition of play that the original order of play must be preserved throughout the competition.

In addition to the competitions listed above, many clubs conduct competitions which are not specifically covered in the Rules of Golf. Often these are the more popular types of play. It cannot be too strongly emphasized however, that since these competitions are not covered by the Rules of Golf, the Committee must carefully lay down in advance and publish the Conditions of Play. The New Zealand Golf Association will not, except in the most exceptional circumstances give a decision on any query submitted, when play is conducted otherwise than in accordance with the Rules.

Irish Stableford

A team consists of four players. Each player plays their own ball for the complete round. Only one card is kept per team signed by the marker and one other member of the team.

Format: For the first six holes played, the best Stableford score counts for your team. For the next six holes played, the best two Stableford scores totaled count. For the final six holes, the best three totaled count for your team. **The winner is the team with the highest aggregate over the three sections.**

Northern Irish Stableford

A team consists of four players. Each player plays their own ball for the complete round. Only one card is kept per team signed by the marker and one other member of the team.

Format: For the first six holes played, the best two Stableford scores count for your team. For the next six holes played, the best three Stableford scores totaled count. For the final six holes the best four totaled count for your team. **The winner is the team with the highest aggregate over the three sections.**

Twilight Golf

9-Hole Stableford

This is a 9-Hole Stableford with a starting time of 8am and closing time of 6pm each Wednesday. If a round of 18 holes is played, the first 9 holes played are counted for the twilight competition.

Cost is \$5.00 payable at the Pro-shop (includes twos). Visitors \$20.00 inclusive of green fees.

Winner prizes are vouchers of your choice and are available at the office.

Full Lounge and Catering Facilities are available until 9.00pm.

Otago Golf Club Trophy History

Arthur Barnett Cup

This cup was presented to the Club by Arthur Barnett Esquire in 1952 and was first won by Monty Butterfield. These two gentlemen were rival traders in the town and it was a very popular win. The competition is a Single Stableford.

Bruntsfield Medal

In 1873, Mr W.D. Murison presented the Bruntsfield Medal to the Dunedin Golf Club. It was won by Mr John Thomson, whose name was the first to be engraved on the beautifully worked medallion. The medal is still presented annually to the golfer scoring the best two gross rounds in the 36-hole Club Championship qualifying play.

Captain's Trophy

The trophy was presented to the Club in 1967 by Jock Robertson, played as a medal round, is highly desired as an ornament in the centre of many mantelpieces.

Centennial Medal

This medal was presented to the Club in 1971 by Dr N H North as part of the Club's Centennial celebrations. It was designed by David North, manufactured by Doug Porteous and the gold provided by Eddie Roche.

Centennial Silver Salver

This trophy was presented to the Club by the Otago Ladies' Golf Club as part of the Centennial celebrations in 1971.

Haggitt Cup

This cup was presented to the Club in 1929 by A N Haggitt who was Club Captain in 1929-1930 and again in 1938-1939. This is a premier trophy which is decided by a single handicap knock-out competition.

Mitchell Cup

This cup was presented to the Club in 1929 by the then Club President Fred Mitchell Esquire. First played for in 1930, and is played as a greensome foursome par.

Northsiders Cup

This cup is played for by right handers only and is played on the same day as the Southpaw Cup. It is a single stableford competition.

Kenneth Ross Memorial

This Combined Stableford trophy was presented by A G Sime Senior in 1943 in memory of Kenneth Ross, a multiple winner of the Club Championships and a very popular member of the Club.

J A Scouler Trophy

J A Scouler was appointed a Life Member of the Club in 1972 after giving many years of service. The trophy was presented in 1975 to be played as an American Foursomes.

Smeaton Cup

This cup was presented to the Club in 1950 by J.W.Smeaton at the conclusion of his term as Club President. It was played as a Four Ball knock-out competition and is another much sought after trophy.

Southpaw Cup

This cup is played for by left handers and is a single par competition.

St Andrew's Cross

This is the oldest golfing trophy in the Southern Hemisphere. It was presented to the Club by the founder, Charles Ritchie Howden, in 1872 for annual competition on St. Andrew's Day.

Telfer Medal

This medal was presented to the Dunedin Golf Club in 1875 by John Telfer. It was first won outright on 2nd January, 1875 by Professor John Shand, one of the three original professors of Otago University. The medal was presented back to the Club in 1970 by Professor Shand's daughters.

Veterans' Cup

This cup was presented to the Club in 1935 by H Brash for competition by members over the age of 50.

W G Wight Memorial

W G Wight was a former Club Champion and a popular member of the Club Executive. The trophy was originally played as a Foursome Handicap knock-out but was changed to a single stableford competition in 1967.
